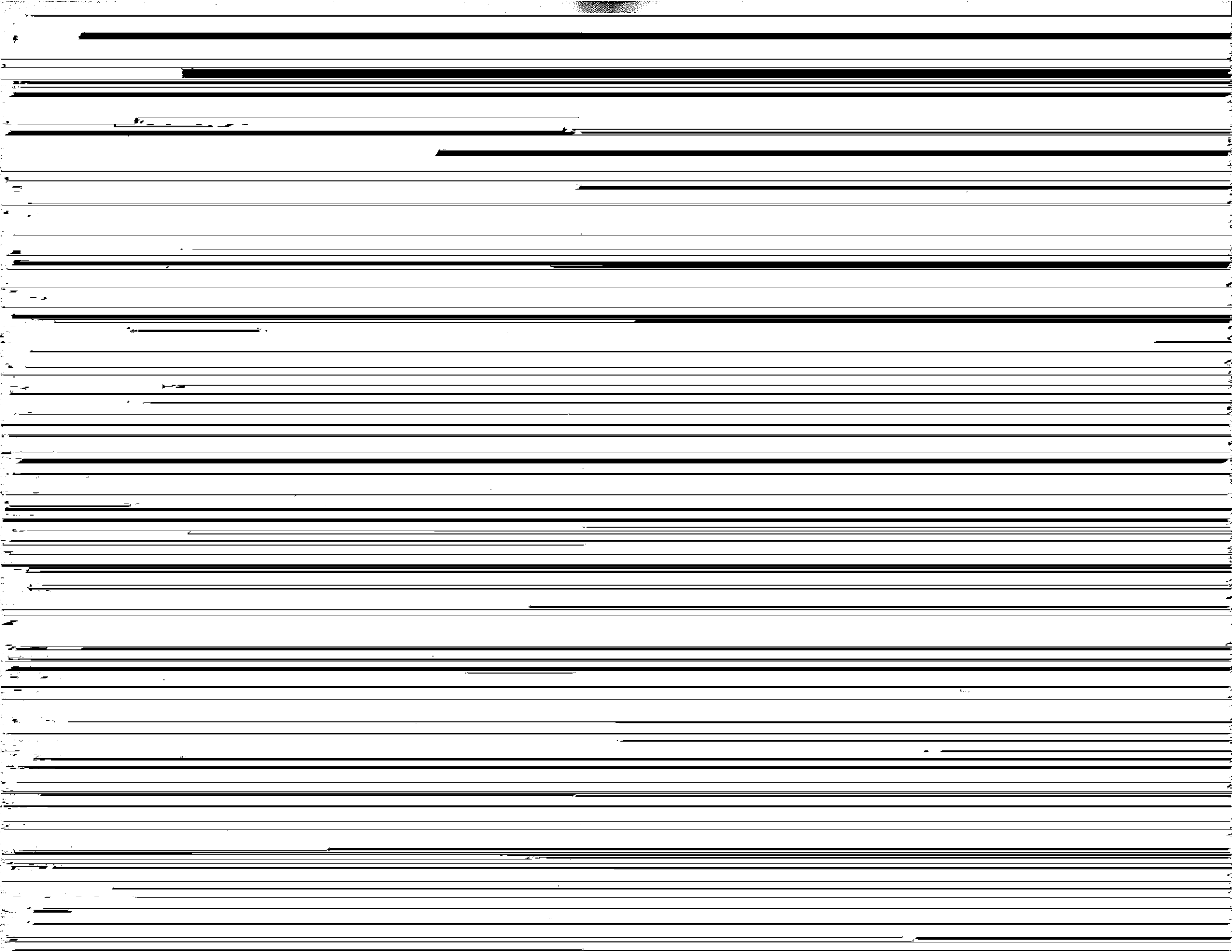

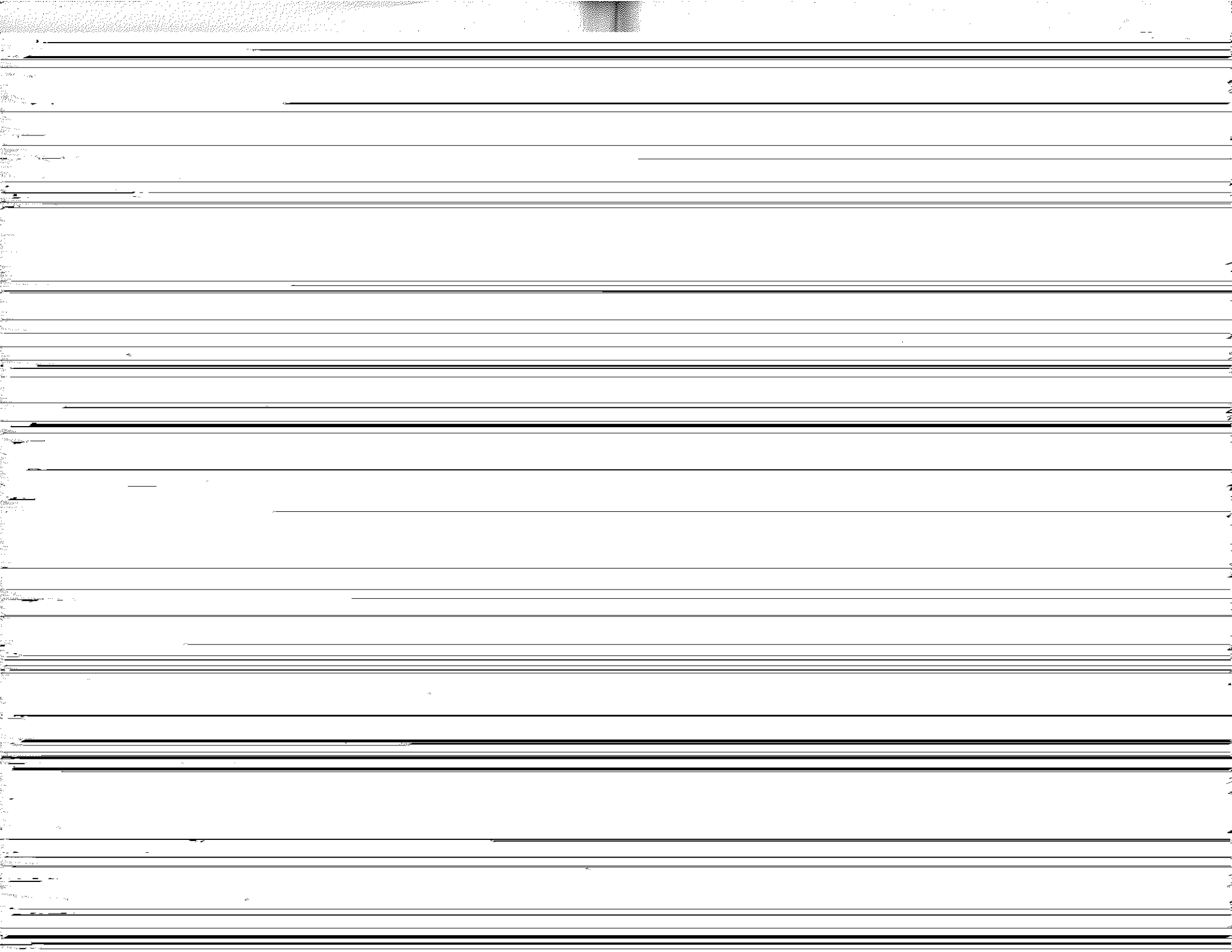

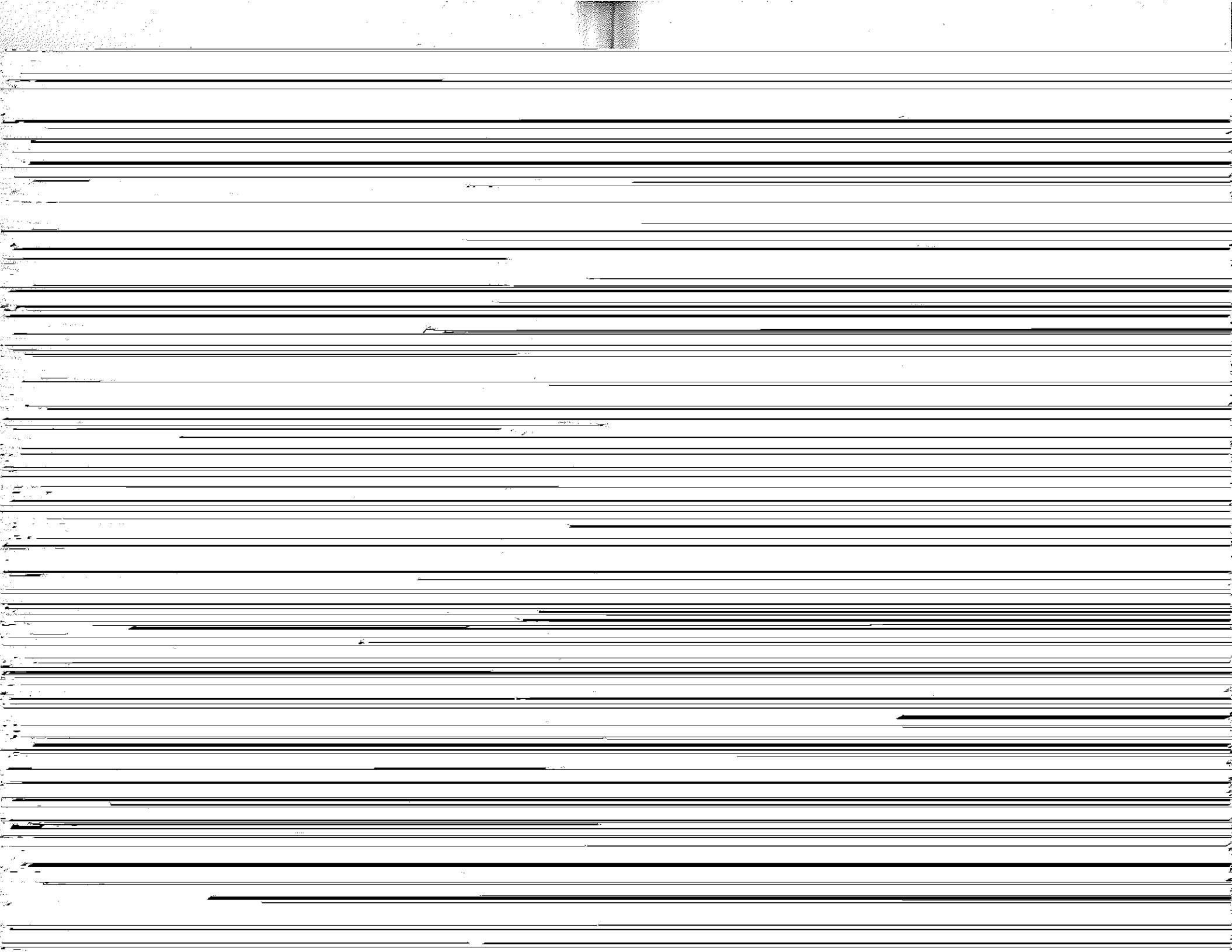


GENERAL REMARKS

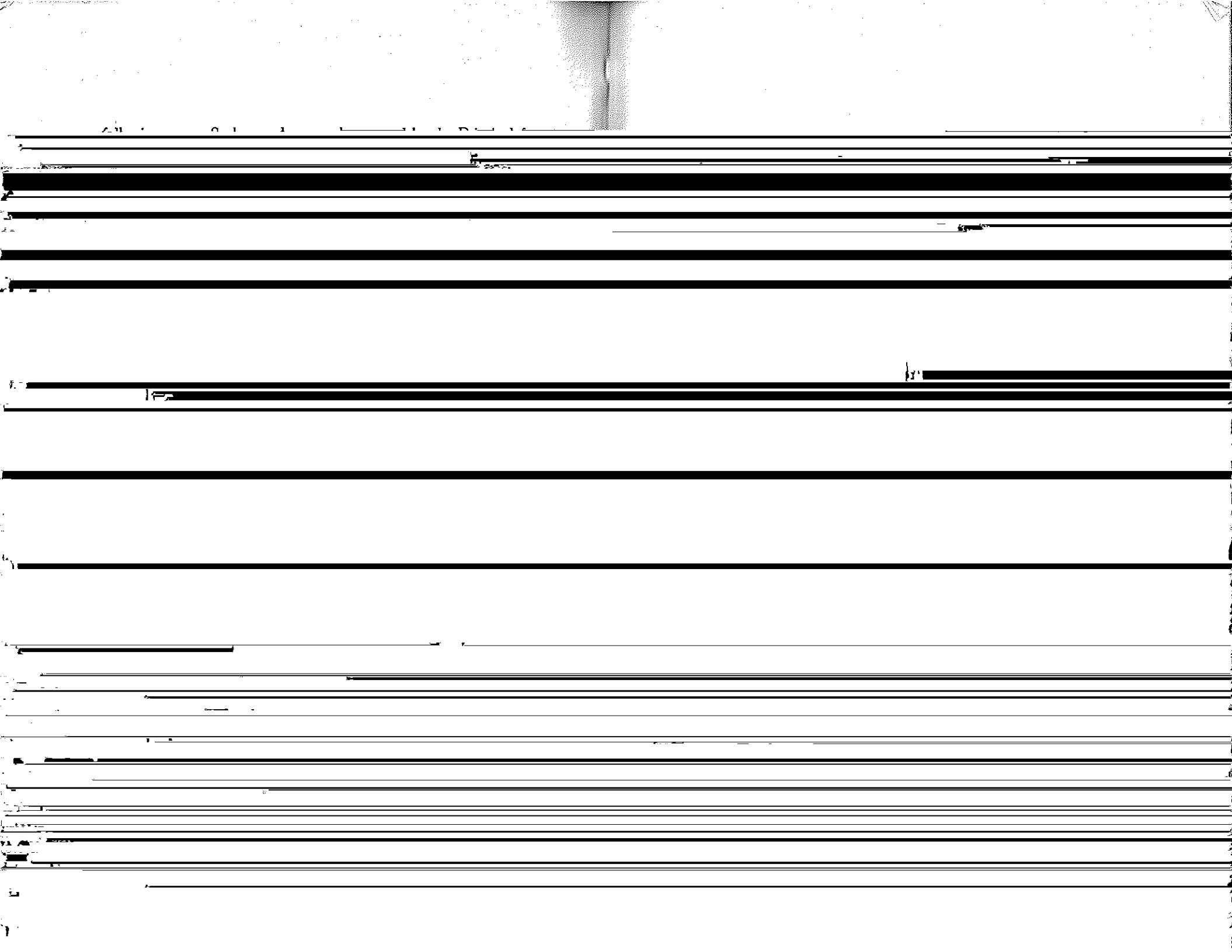

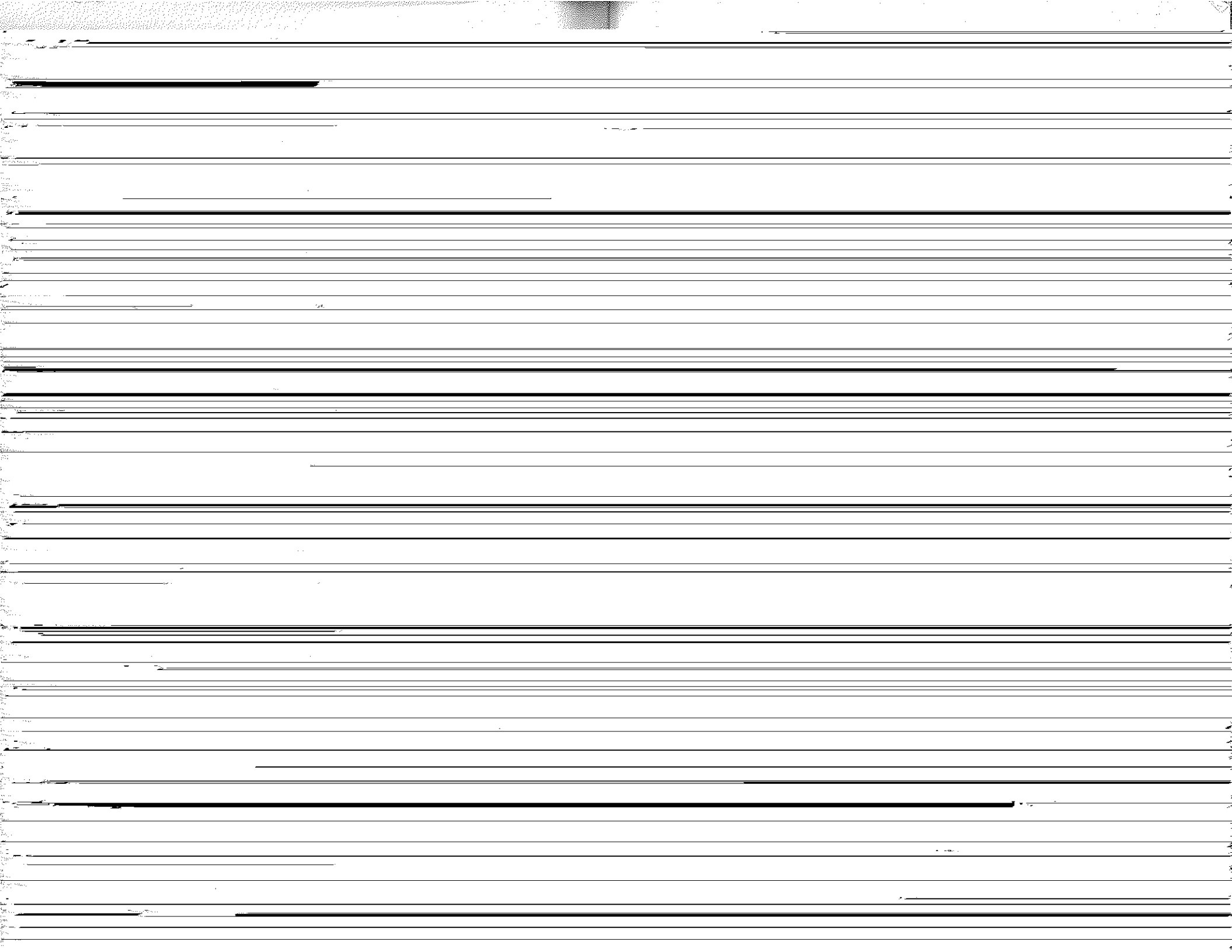
The efforts that were of late years put forth toward the extension

The regular time for admission is at the beginning of each term, in



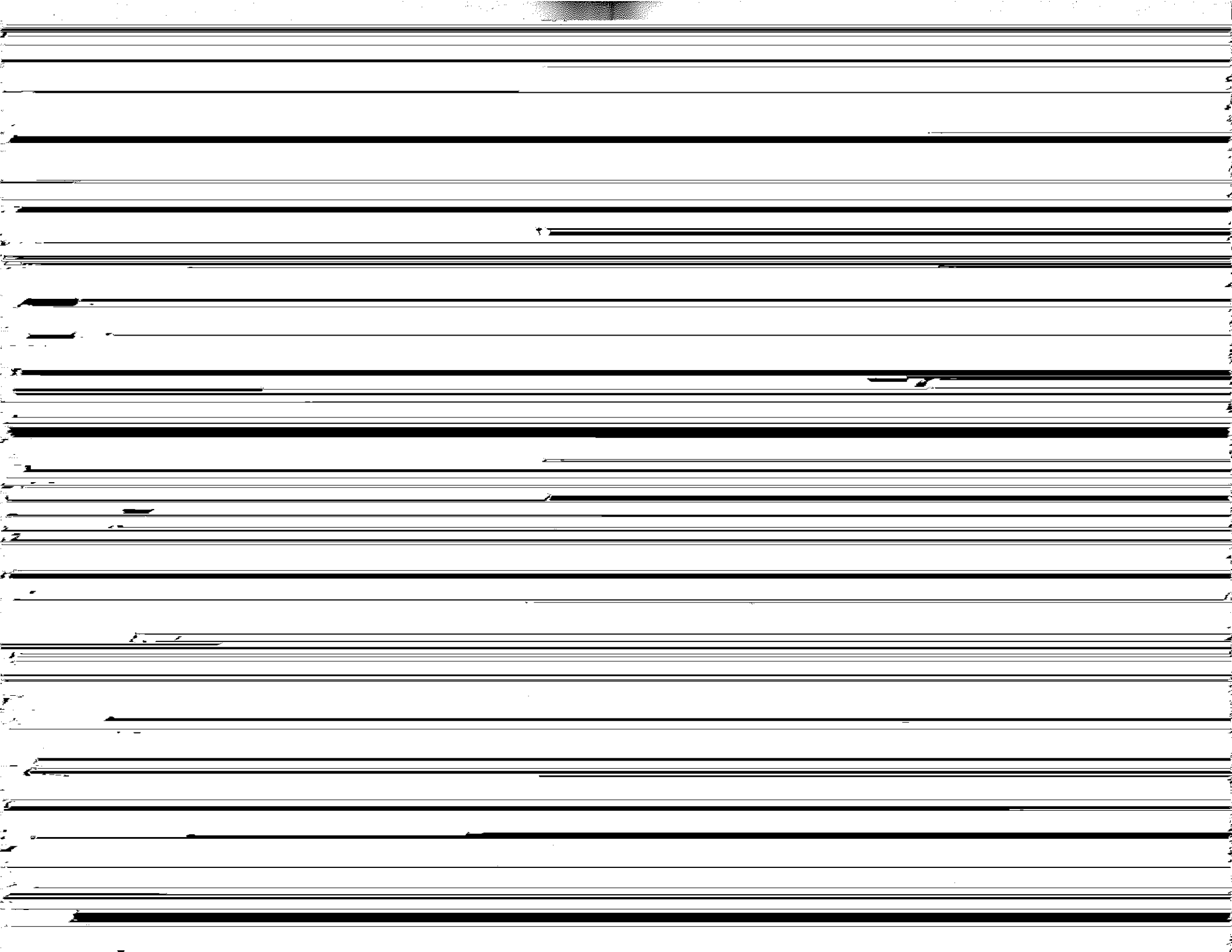


supplied the church with pastors who have shown themselves pious and active workers for the cause of Christ.
